Day Hosts – Day hosts provide transportation to our guests whenever it may be needed during the visit.

<u>**Goody Bags**</u> – Appropriate Georgia gifts for our guests.

Dinner Hosts – For those who are not home/day hosting. Prepare a dinner in your home for 8-10 club members and ambassadors.

Farewell Party – Reserve venue, select menu or restaurant, entertainment, etc.

<u>Airport Transportation</u> – Basically getting our visitors (and their luggage) from/to the airport. Generally, our visitors will meet their home hosts at a centralized location. "Many hands make light work."

Calgary, Alberta

For club members who may be curious about Calgary, the following was obtained from Wikipedia, the online encyclopedia.

Calgary is the largest city in Alberta, and the largest metro area within the three Prairie Provinces. As of 2021, the city had a population of 1,306,784, and a metropolitan area population of 1,481,806, making it the third-largest city and fifth-largest metropolitan area in Canada.

Calgary is situated at the confluence of the Bow River and the Elbow River, in the southwest of the province, in the transitional area between the Rocky Mountain foothills and the Canadian prairies.

Calgary's economy includes activity in the energy, financial services, film and television, transportation and logistics, and tourism sectors. The Calgary Metropolitan Region is home to Canada's second-largest number of corporate head offices. In 2015, Calgary had the largest number of millionaires per capita of any major Canadian city. In 2022, Calgary was ranked alongside Zurich as the third most livable city in the world, ranking first in Canada and in North America. In 1988, it was the first Canadian city to host the Olympic Winter Games.

In 1787, David Thompson , a cartographer with the Hudson's Bay Company, was the first recorded European to visit the area. John Glenn was the first documented European settler in the Calgary area in 1873. In the fall of 1875, the site became a post of the Northwest Mounted Police, assigned to protect the western plains from US whisky traders, and to protect the fur trade. Their fort was named Fort Calgary in 1876. In 1877, the First Nations ceded title to the region.
